What is the impact of the What Matters Most (WMM) dot phrase?


Patient's hopes/expectations? Patient's fears/concerns?

Implementation: July 2020 through April 14, 2021


Population: Patients aged 65+ arriving in the ED

WMM for **351** out of **6,752 patients** was recorded by providers during this period (**5.2**%)


Of 41 providers, almost half used the dot phrase **more than a few times** during this period.




The hopes/expectations categories were chosen 495 times (multiple selections were allowed). Treatment, testing, and diagnosis make up over 90% of the selections.




Most months, almost all patients (in the sample of 495) expected their symptoms to be treated and most anticipated testing and getting a diagnosis. Less than half expected a referral, and mostly during the fall, tailing off into the winter months.






The fears/concerns categories were chosen 508 times (multiple selections were allowed). Patients seem less worried about needing surgery or becoming dependent than about worsening symptoms and general concerns.



Most months, many patients (in the sample of 508) expressed concerns about their disease and feared their symptoms would worsen. A smaller portion worried about needing surgery (peaking in Oct/Nov) and even fewer appear consistently concerned about loss of independence.
